
THE EASTER VIGIL IN THE HOLY NIGHT

MARCH 30, 2024 8:45PM In accord with ancient tradition, this night is one of vigil for the Lord (Ex 12:42). The Gospel of Luke (12:35ff) is a reminder to the faithful to have their lamps burning ready, to be like men awaiting their master's return so that when he arrives he will find them wide awake and will seat them at his table.

FIRST PART: LUCERNARIUM

BLESSING OF THE FIRE & PREPARATION OF THE CANDLE

PROCESSION

The dialog, "The Light of Christ." is sung three times: at the entrance of the church, midway up the main aisle, and in front of the sanctuary.



THE EASTER PROCLAMATION (EXSULTET)

Following the Exsultet, the assembly extinguishes their candles and is seated for the liturgy of the word.





PSALM PRAYER (all stand)


Sung last on Holy Thursday, the Glory to God, ancient hymn of praise, is sung with full conviction in
