Cantor: When death to life in fearsome strains Gives way as Christ his life regains, The prince of Life immortal reigns. O praise the Lamb!

All: What saw you, Mary, on the way? "I saw the tomb where Jesus lay; His glory brightens us this day." O praise the Lamb!

Cantor: "I saw the angels and did hear The witness they did volunteer; The winding cloths were also near." O praise the Lamb!

All: "Christ now appears before his own In Galilee where he is known. Hopes are fulfilled; his wounds are shown." O praise the Lamb!

We know that Christ now lives indeed; Victorious King, we humbly plead For mercy in our ev'ry need. O praise the Lamb!
