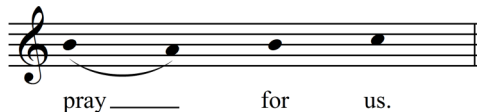
The Gathering Song is sung as the family and ministers process to the front of the Church.
