Let us with heart and mind and soul now love God in return.

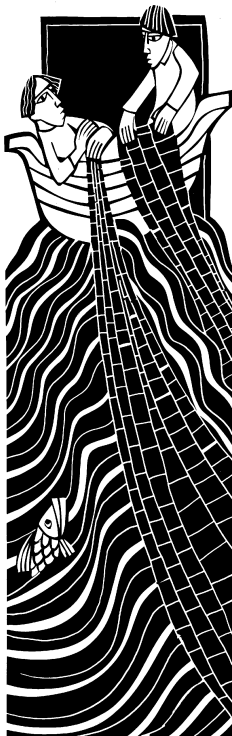
Forgive we now each other's faults as we our faults confess;
