This Week's Bible Verse

“Don't worry about anything, instead pray about everything.” – Philippians 4:6

Today's Lesson, Chapter 24: We Grow in Holiness

We learn that we grow in holiness through prayer, the sacraments, and the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

- Think about someone you know who follows the example of Jesus' life. What makes them holy? What makes them a good role model for living a Christian life? In this chapter we will learn ways in which we can grow in holiness to become more like our role models!
- Read chapter 24, on pages 204-207. Don't skip the text boxes!
 - Vocab words that may be helpful as you read the chapter:
 - Psalms** = a book of the Old Testament in the Bible
 - Synagogue** = church where people of Jewish religion pray
- Remember that the *fruits* of the Holy Spirit are the good things that people can see in us when we respond to the *gifts* of the Holy Spirit. Take another look at the box on page 207 which lists the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Which gift of the Holy Spirit are you really good at responding to? Which one would you like to work on?

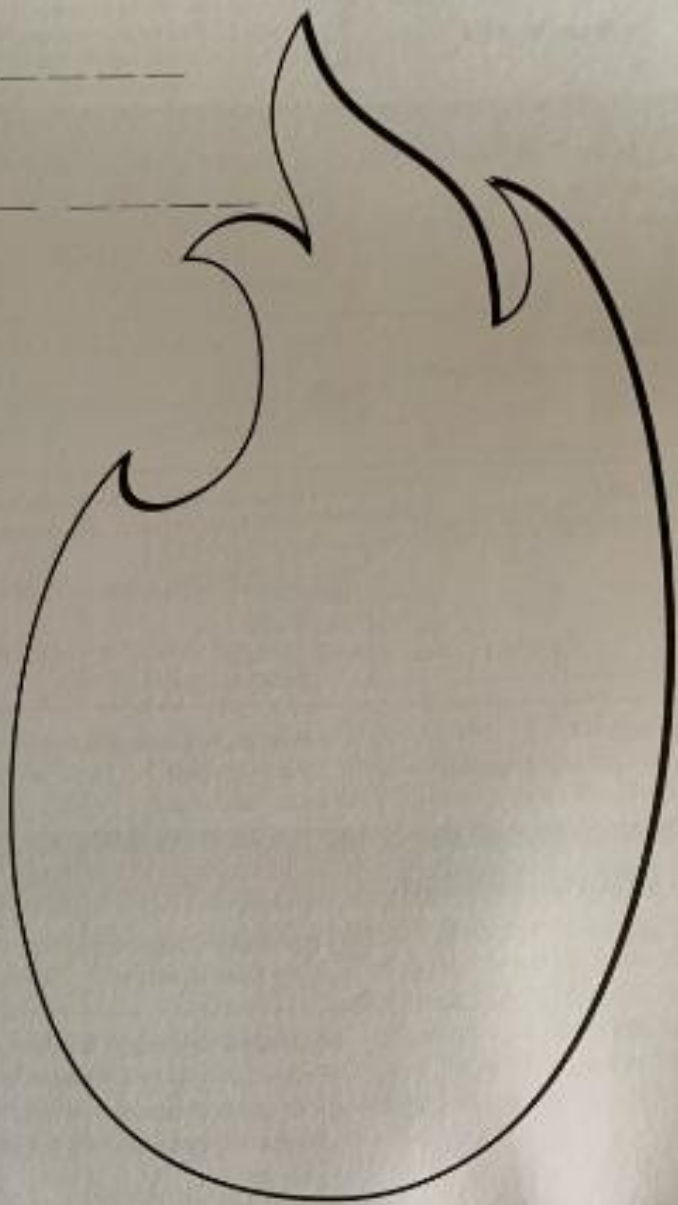

BAPTISM



Baptism takes away original sin, all personal sins and removes any punishment due to sin. It gives our souls the new life of grace and makes us children of God.

CONFIRMATION



In Confirmation the Holy Spirit gives us His gifts and power to help us grow to be strong Christians. The Bishop anoints us with "chrism" oil to serve God and others. Write the names of the gifts of the Holy Spirit in the flames above.

HOLY EUCHARIST

The Holy Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Jesus. When we receive Holy Communion we are united more closely to Jesus and we grow in love for God and others.



MATRIMONY

The sacrament of Matrimony unites a man and a woman together as husband and wife. It gives them a special grace to live for Jesus and to fulfill the duties and dignity of marriage.



CONFESSION

In Confession we confess, or tell, our sins to a priest. God forgives our sins through the priest and fills us with grace and joy to help us obey Him and do what is right.

HOLY ORDERS

In Holy Orders, bishops ordain men to become bishops, priests, or deacons. God gives these men special graces and power to serve Him and others.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In the Anointing of the Sick, the priest anoints the sick person with blessed oil and lays his hands on them for healing, strength, peace, and courage. This Sacrament also forgives sins if the person is not able to go to Confession.

**Pope Francis has given us a simple way to pray using our 5 fingers!
In the ovals, draw and color whom you will pray for with each finger.**

The next finger is your index, or pointing finger. Pray for those who teach you, instruct you, and heal you. They point you in the right direction! They need God's support and wisdom to direct others. Always keep them in your prayers.

The following finger is the tallest. It reminds us of our leaders and those who have authority in our lives. They need God's guidance.

4.

The fourth finger, your ring finger, is your weakest finger! This finger reminds us to pray for the weakest, the sick, or those with problems. They need our prayers.

5.

Finally you have your little finger, the smallest of all. Your pinkie reminds you to pray for yourself! When you are done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs more clearly. You will be able to pray for yourself in a better way. God bless you!

Your thumb is the closest finger to you. Start by praying for those who are closest to you. They are the persons easiest to remember. To pray for our dear ones is a 'sweet duty.'
