
CROSSROADS



It has been a busy summer for the St John Future Home Committee, but if you aren't a committee member you might wonder what the heck has been going on.

We have continued our fundraising, reaching out to those we have not yet heard from. Those efforts are ongoing. To date, we have heard from 911 families and received 505 gifts. Pledges and funds raised total \$6,123,951. If you and your family have not yet made a gift to the campaign please prayerfully consider it. We need you!

We have also met with contractors interested in building our church. Following the initial interviews we prepared a proposal request document for interested contractors. The Archdiocese of Cincinnati assisted us in preparing the request for proposal document.

Contractor bids were recently received. The committee is now in the process of selecting 2 or 3 finalists who will be individually interviewed by Fr. Kemper, Paul Roell and our committee members. We hope to select our contractor sometime in October. Then we will work with the contractor, and the architect, to begin the design and specification process. The goal is to begin site improvement work next spring. The next step after that is church construction. That is planned for 2017 if things remain on schedule.

We'll provide another update after the contractor is selected. Thank you for your contributions and prayers.

Salvadoran's Come To Visit

On Wednesday, July 29th, through Saturday, August 8th, St. John the Baptist was blessed with a visit from members of our sister parishes, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and Santa Cruz, El Salvador. They came to spend time with us and share here in the solidarity which has grown through our annual visits with them.

From each parish we were blessed with their pastors coming, along with the pastoral leaders who lead the scholarship programs for the children we have been sponsoring. The persons who came from Our Lady of Guadalupe were: Pastor, Padre Joaquin Melendez, Mario Ramirez and Guillermo Araujo. Coming to visit us from Santa Cruz were: Pastor, Padre Jorge Grande, Jose Neri Arias, Maria del Carmen Melendez and Jose Lius Villalobos. Also coming with them was Elba Moreira who works with CRISPAZ, (Christians for Peace in El Salvador) which is the non-profit organization that works with us every year to provide the food, lodging and transportation services for our visits to El Salvador. Elba, who is a Salvadoran resident, is fluent in both Spanish and English and she serves as our delegation leader and translator during our visits. She agreed to come and visit us here, to spend time with us, and provide her translation services during their visit.

The group from Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish arrived first on Wednesday evening, July 29th. On Thursday the group, together with members of St. John's, visited the Art Museum in Mt. Adams since Padre Joaquin is an avid student of fine art and was looking for the opportunity to explore what we have here in Cincinnati. That evening we had dinner at the home of Dave and Cathy Grimm. Bishop Joe Binzer, who is a friend of the Grimm family, came and joined us that evening.

On Friday we began with Mass and breakfast at St. John's which was followed by a visit to the homebound of our parish so that our friends from Our Lady of Guadalupe could meet them. We then had lunch at the home of Don and Mary Meiners. After lunch we met at St. John the Baptist to reflect on the scriptures for the Feast of the Transfiguration. The word "El Salvador," as we know, means "The Savior," in English and that feast, on August 6th, is the patronal feast for their country. The country of El Salvador is essentially closed down that week to celebrate the feast. In the evening we attended the Cincinnati Reds vs. the Pittsburgh Pirates game, which was the first time that our friends from Our Lady of Guadalupe had seen a professional baseball game in the United States.

On Saturday morning we visited the Fire Museum in Cincinnati. The tour was led by former firefighter, Dave Grimm. After that visit we went to Findlay Market and our guests enjoyed a morning of shopping there. Our guests from Our Lady of Guadalupe shared Mass with us at 4:00 p.m. while our guests from Santa Cruz were arriving at the Cincinnati airport. Our friends from both parishes, along with all three of our priests and members of our parish who have been to El Salvador, met for dinner at El Mariachi in Harrison.

On Sunday, August 2nd, we all celebrated Mass together at 11:00 a.m. with readings in both languages and we were pleased to listen to the words of the pastors from both parishes. Sunday afternoon we met at the Knights of Columbus Hall for a welcoming party. Guillerimo Araujo, from Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, who is a talented artist and works with the children at his parish, did an art project with children who came from St. John's and all enjoyed the get together. For dinner we gathered at St. John's for a grill out.

On Monday, August 3rd, we took our guests to the Hofbrauhaus in Newport, Kentucky. Since this is the only Hofbrauhaus in the United States, they enjoyed a taste of our German heritage. Then we took the Duck Tour across the river to Cincinnati that enabled them to see our downtown. Then we visited Smale Riverfront Park in Cincinnati. We all ate dinner at the Cabana in Sayler Park joined by many of the members of St. John the Baptist Parish.

On Tuesday we all gathered for brunch at the home of Denny and Patty Schultz. Then we traveled to Su Casa, the Hispanic ministry center in Cincinnati, and met with several Salvadorans who have come to the United States who discussed their journey and the issues that they encountered when they came here. Their stories were familiar ones to our guests from El Salvador who are aware of families within their parishes who have had loved ones travel here to the United States. After dinner at Monk's in Harrison we gathered at the Youth House for a discussion with Hub Martini, our Youth Minister, and many of the young people who have participated in the activities of the youth group. Our friends from El Salvador enjoyed hearing of the activities that our young people are involved in and how they live out their faith.

On Wednesday morning our friends from Our Lady of Guadalupe went to the airport to go home, but our friends from Santa Cruz stayed on for the rest of the week. We treated them to lunch at Skyline and then joined had a

discussion at St. John's about the relationship between the two parishes. Dinner that evening was at LaRosa's and then we came to St. John the Baptist for, "Breaking Open the Word" which takes place in the church every Wednesday evening led by Eric Hollis.

On Thursday we met for breakfast at St. John's with our friends from Santa Cruz Parish and participated with them in an exercise of scriptural reflection known as, "Lectio Divina" involving the Feast of the Transfiguration which we celebrated that day. Afterwards, we watched the Cincinnati Reds play the St. Louis Cardinals, and it was also the first visit to a professional baseball game for our friends from Santa Cruz Parish. Unfortunately, it rained much of the game and dampened a bit of the fun. At 7:00 p.m. that evening we celebrated at St. John's, the Feast of the Transfiguration, with the readings, again, in both languages. Some of the liturgical songs were sung by the Salvadorans using traditional songs which are part of their country's celebration of this feast. It was a great opportunity for us to share our faith in prayer with them on this special day.

On Friday morning there was a visit to the homebound for our friends from Santa Cruz Parish. We had lunch at Kreimer's in Miamitown and then the afternoon was left open for shopping, and the opportunity for all to engage in whatever activities they would like. For dinner on Friday evening, Hub and Sue Martini hosted a party at their home which was well attended by members of the parish, and we had the opportunity to present to our Salvadoran friends much of what we do at St. John the Baptist to live out our faith. It was a great concluding activity for the visit.

On Saturday, August 8th, our friends from Santa Cruz went to the Cincinnati airport and we bid them a fond farewell until we see them again when we visit on our annual trip, the first week of February, 2016.



God wants us to transcend the borders and languages which separate us and have us come together in faith and love. These visits help to do that.

We have been blessed by so many St. John's parishioners who participat in sponsoring children in the scholarship program in both of these parishes. The cost per year is \$400 and we thank those who have sponsored children in the past and we hope that you will continue to do so. Friends in Faith 2015

Saturday, August 15, 2015, was our third annual "Friends in Faith" day. The weather was wonderful, complete with a nice breeze under the big tent. The Vacation Bible School children opened the day in song. Hearing those young voices sing of the love of Jesus touched the hearts of all. The purpose of the day is to celebrate our common faith in Jesus and everyone in the community is invited. Father Jim Schutte from St. Leo's, our partner parish, spoke at 2:00 p.m. He talked about when we come to the table of the Lord there are no borders. He brought the Guatemalan band, Ministerio Creacion, and their music had everyone on their feet clapping and praising God! It didn't matter that they sang in Spanish. Everyone could feel the message and the Holy Spirit was moving. The children were invited to participate in Stations of Faith in the church. They portrayed significant stories from the bible in the church. They made them come alive and real. The adults enjoyed hearing the stories too. Later in the day the children were offered storytelling and puppet making with Joy Gemperline, our Director of Religious Education.



Our own Brenda Behr delighted everyone with her story and sense of humor. She shared her faith in God and a message of hope, even in dark times.

Ron Miller and his sister Janel sang, "I Believe, and the Ave Maria," woven together. The people loved it and wanted MORE!

We had a young friend in faith, Zoey Eagan, travel from St. Michael's in Sharonville with her grandmother, Deb Eagan. Zoey sang two songs, "Mary, Did You Know," and the Christian version of, "Somewhere Over the Rainbow," to a spellbound audience.

As customary, we had the sacrament of Reconciliation at 3:15 p.m. in the church followed by 4:00 p.m. Mass. Jane O'Donnell sang a prelude piece, "How Beautiful Is The Body of Christ," and the "body" responded with smiles, tears and applause!

Everyone gathered under the big tent for Monk's pizza, salad, homemade desserts and fellowship for supper. Drinks and snacks were available throughout the day and Jim Davis kept the hot popcorn coming!

Pastor John Hembree, Harrison Ave. Assembly of God, took the stage and spoke on our partnership with their food pantry. He thanked us for our faithful support and how much it means to those in our community.

Catholic Lay Evangelist, Eric Hollis delivered a message in two parts: 1. Where Do I Fit In? 2. What Should I Do? Send Me! He left us with 23 quotes from the bible. Each one had "one another" in the quote. For example: John 13:34 Love One Another ~ Romans 12:10 Honor One Another ~ Colossians 3:16 Forgive One Another ~ Galations 5:13 Serve One Another.

The Bill Tonnis Band took the stage for the evening and had us all singing along to contemporary Christian music.

As night fell we had a candlelight procession to the church for Taizé Prayer, a reflective, meditative, sung prayer. It is ecumenical prayer that began in 1940 in Taizé, France. Our music director, Michael Johnson, offers Taizé several times a year on Friday evenings.

Friends in Faith is a day of celebrating faith with young and old alike, and different Christian faiths as well. There were Catholics, Pentecostals, Methodists and non-denominational believers as well. We all came together as friends in faith.



The RCIA process is a fruit of the 2nd Vatican Council from the 1960's. The RCIA is more than a program. It is a conversion process. It is very personal and very individual. We initiated the RCIA Team here at St. John's under the leadership of Father Edward Shine and Deacon Christopher Lack in 1989. So, it has been 26 years that we have seen the blessings of the RCIA. Over 400 persons have embraced faith in the Catholic tradition at St. John the Baptist since the RCIA began. Not to mention the impact that it's had on the families & friends of those new members and even the broader community. You probably know someone yourself!

The RCIA process is a team effort. There is a coordinator, Laura Noyes, and catechists (teachers) Deacon Don Meyer, Kat Lang, Tom and Nancy Gruber, Mike Re, Connie and Jim Davis, Diane Brockman, Diane Detmer, Eric Hollis and Lynda Noel. Other team members of hospitality and sponsors are Mike Noyes, Steve Dahmann, Pam McLaughlin and Margie Kunze. Team members have come and gone over the years. We've even had RCIA participants join the team after they have been initiated into the church.
