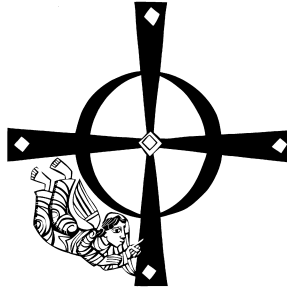


PLACING OF THE PALL
