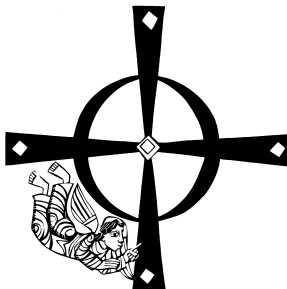


PLACING OF THE PALL

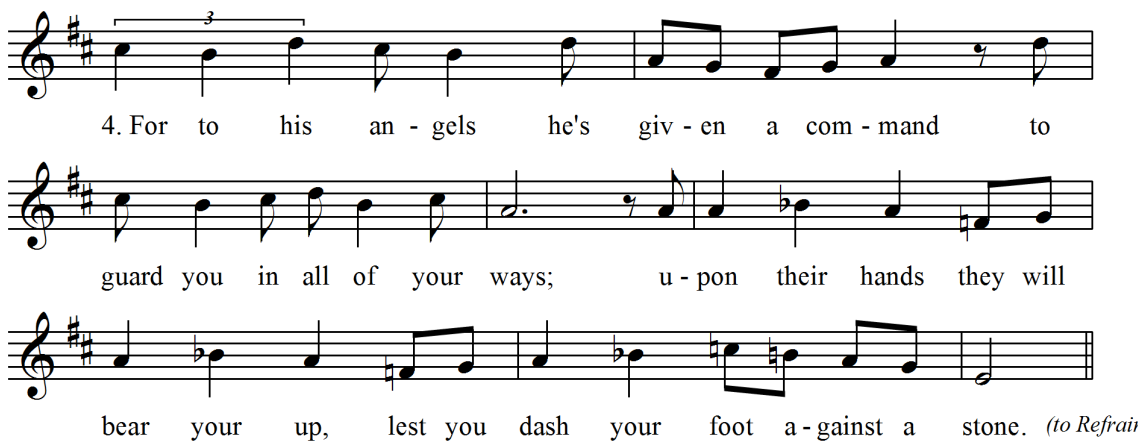

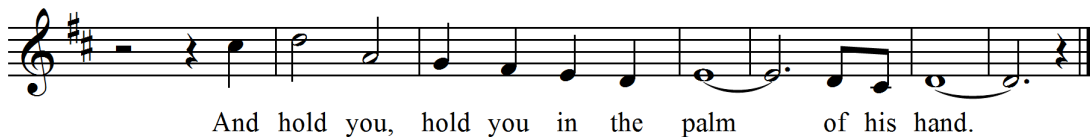

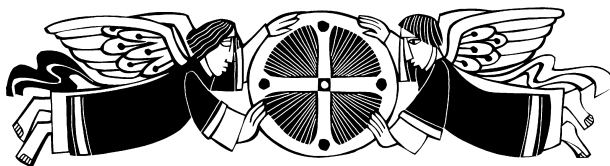

Anyone not receiving Communion is welcome to come forward for a blessing by crossing their arms over their chest.

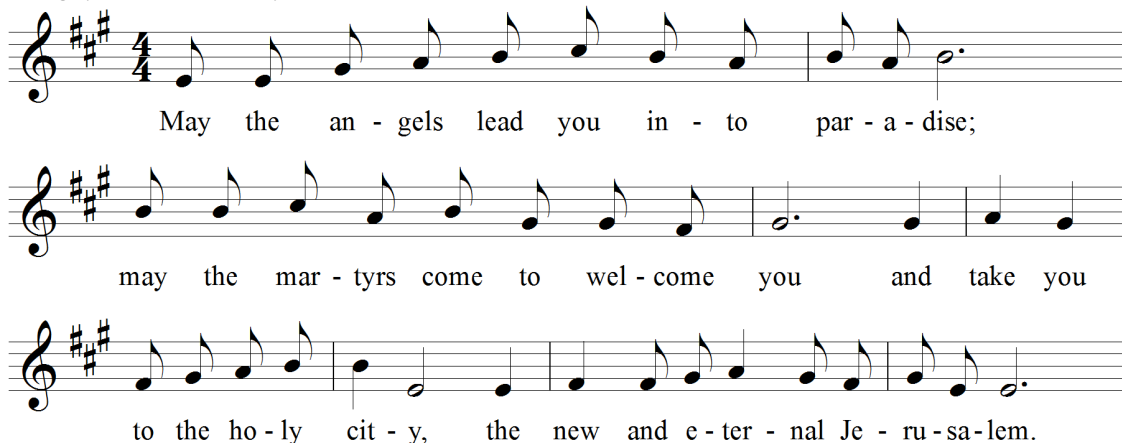

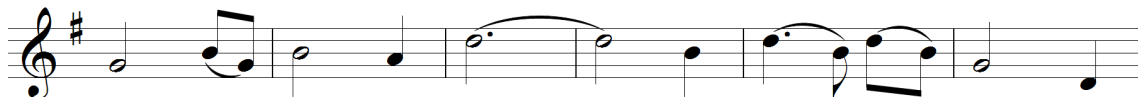
