

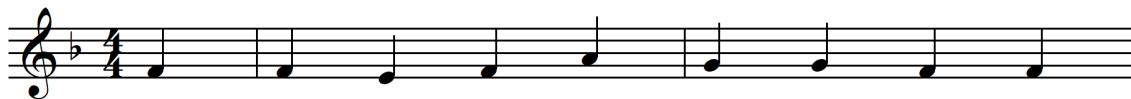

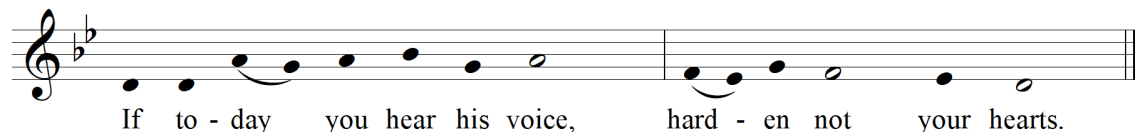

THE FIRST SCRUTINY OF THE ELECT

This is the first of three such rituals for those preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. The elect express their repentance, and the assembly prays for them in a special way, as they continue their Lenten journey towards the Easter sacraments.

PRAYER OVER THE ELECT

A prayer is offered, addressed to God the Father, asking that the elect be set free from falsehood, darkness and sin. In the laying on of hands by the priest, the transformational power of the Holy Spirit is signified. Concluding is a prayer addressed to Jesus, that he might send the Spirit to give “living water” to the Elect.

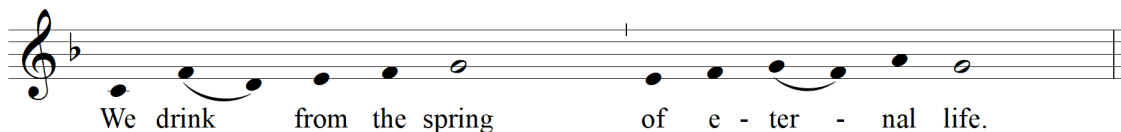
