

## RITE OF RECONCILIATION

#### Examination of Conscience

A period of silence is given so that each person may personally examine their conscience.

The following questions are intended to serve as a guide.

## "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

- Am I humble enough to acknowledge my total dependence on God?
- Am I able to admit to others that I don't have all the answers? Can I admit mistakes without blaming others?

## "Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted."

- What has been my attitude towards situations which caused me grief and sorrow?
- Have I accepted them and learned from them?
- Have I been able to say: "I am sorry" and really mean it?
- Do I have an "I don't care attitude" about the evils in society?

#### "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land."

- Am I humble enough to handle conflicts and insults without an "ego crisis"?
- Am I able to affirm others rather than criticize them?
- Do I respect the worth of others?
- Am I a good listener?

## "Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied."

- What is the primary focus of my life?
- Do I seek for acceptance, success and material possessions?
- Do I really want to seek and find a relationship with God?
- Do I listen with attention and devotion to the Word of God proclaimed?
- Am I hungry for Eucharist?

## "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy."

- Am I sensitive to others' needs? Do the needs of others come before my own?
- Do I give of myself without thinking of what I will receive in return?
- Am I a caring, compassionate, merciful person in my dealings with others?

## "Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God."

- Am I a person of integrity and sincerity? Am I honest about my own faults and failings?
- Do I treat others with respect and love? Have I ever used anyone as an object for my own pleasure?

## "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called the children of God."

- Do I return evil for evil?
- Am I a person who bridges differences between people of other races, nationalities and religions?
- Do I accept genuinely and sincerely those who do not agree with me?
- Am I at peace with myself, with my family, friends, and those with whom I live and work?

# "Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

- Do I examine myself and my conduct in light of the Gospel call to be a disciple?
- Am I able to suffer in silence or am I always complaining about something?
- Do I uphold the teachings of the Church to the best of my ability when they are attacked?
- Do I follow my conscience or acquiesce to peer pressure?

#### ACT OF REPENTANCE

The community prays together the Confiteor:


I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do;
