Congregational refrain (R./)



In you, — O Lord, I take re - fuge.

Verse 1 (*choir women*): Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is remitted. Blessed the man to whom the Lord imputes no guilt, in whose spirit is no guile. *R./*

Verse 2 (*choir men*): I kept it secret and my frame was wasted. I groaned all day long. *R./*

Verse 3 (*choir women*): To you I have acknowledged my sin; my guilt I did not hide. I said, "I will confess my transgression to the Lord." And you have forgiven the guilt of my sin. *R./*

Verse 4 (*choir all*): I will instruct you and teach you the way you should go; I will fix my eyes upon you. *R./*
